RAILROAD WORK TO TAKE 8 MONTHS

Sahuarita Town Manager Shane Dille told the Town Council on Monday that there is some progress on the traffic light at Quail Crossing Boulevard and Old Nogales Highway, at the entrance to Quail Creek.

Union Pacific signed a construction and maintenance agreement May 17 that indicated it would begin designing and procuring parts for the railroad crossing. His report noted Union Pacific expects work to take about eight months.

Dille's report noted there is an Aug. 7 hearing scheduled with the Arizona Corporation Commission on the matter.

SPECIAL-NEEDS GROUP SEEKING NEW VAN

A non-profit for adults with special needs is looking for donations to buy a second van to keep up with growth.

"It's just so joyful to ride around in the van with them," she said. "They're always singing or laughing and just having fun."
